Sabrina has a background in psychology and is working as an animal behaviour & welfare consultant, travelling world wide to universities, zoos, research labs, wildlife sanctuaries and conservations centres. In 1992 she started at the rehabilitation centre for stranded marine mammals in the Netherlands and has since worked with a variety of captive and wild animals in different settings. Sabrina teaches as a guest lecturer on the MRes in Marine Mammal Science at the St. Andrews University in Scotland, teaches a IAT CPD course on enrichment for laboratory animals, sits on the Advisory Council of the Barcelona Zoo in Spain and is a Visiting Scholar at the Franklin and Marshall College in Lancaster - USA. She is a lecturer at Tinley Education in the Netherlands, collaborates with the Royal Dutch Police Force and serves as an External Expert on an EU project titled "EU Zoos and Science in the 21st Century: engaging the public in nature conservation". In her free time she volunteers for PASA, a network of primate conservation sanctuaries in Africa as well as other conservation centres worldwide.
